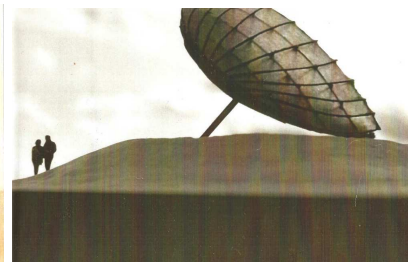
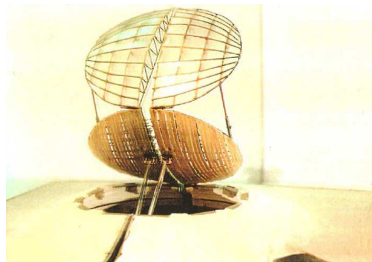
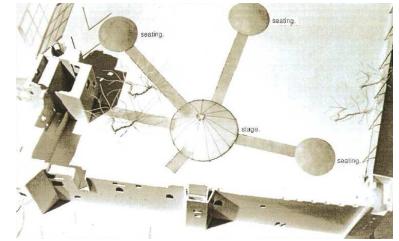

A feasibility study for a proposed museum and visitors centre at Newark Castle in Nottinghamshire.

JMF responded to the detailed brief provided by SPAB, by firstly undertaking a comprehensive site appraisal, due to the historic constraints of the castle.

The preferred option responds to the need to maintain as much of the existing building fabric, and without obscuring the existing castle's views and details.

The proposal includes a number of subterranean zones linked by corridors, where the entire proposal acts as a gallery. The individual roof structures open using hydraulic arms to form an external performance area with associated seating.
